



Postsecondary Education: Autistic Collegians' Experiences of Success

OUR RECOMMENDATIONS:

FACULTY:

- Use office hours to discover autistic students' interests and clarify course expectations
- Draw on autistic students' interests for class assignments
- Recognize autistic students' strengths

ADVISORS:

- Ensure autistic students are taking the right courses to meet their academic aspirations
- Make academic plans explicit and collaborative

ADMINISTRATORS:

- Track autistic students' retention and graduation rates
- Provide training to faculty on supporting autistic students in the classroom
