Supporting Autistic College Student Success through the I.P.A.C.E. Framework



This framework comes from a national study of 425 autistic undergraduate student participants.

IDENTITY: Considers how students develop and understand their multiple identities during college

PSYCHOLOGY: Recognizes the prevalence of mental health-related concerns among autistic college students

ACADEMICS: Notes the importance of academic factors like GPA and graduation in influencing how autistic students define success

COMMUNITY: Explores the role of social belonging with other people in determining success

EMPLOYMENT: Focuses on the relationship between college and meaningful career opportunities as a marker of success

We asked 425 undergraduate autistic students to reflect on how each of these domains factored into their definitions of success
